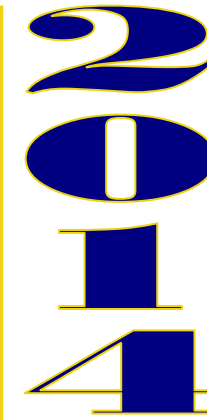

DIRECTIONS

Two options from points north and east:

Take I-695 (Baltimore Beltway) to I-95 south. Remain in right two lanes, and take exit 59 (Eastern Avenue). Turn right onto Eastern Avenue and proceed through six traffic lights to the Bayview Boulevard entrance on right. Follow signs to the Johns Hopkins East Parking Garage and then follow signs to the Asthma & Allergy Center.
Take 895 S to Lombard Street Exit. Follow signs to the Johns Hopkins East Parking Garage and then follow signs to the Asthma & Allergy Center.

Two options from points south:

Take I-95 through the Fort McHenry Tunnel to exit 59 (Eastern Avenue). Turn left onto Eastern Ave. and proceed through six traffic lights to the Bayview Boulevard entrance on right. Follow signs to the Johns Hopkins East Parking Garage and then follow signs to the Asthma & Allergy Center.
Take 895 N through the Harbor Tunnel to Lombard Street Exit. Follow signs to the Johns Hopkins East Parking Garage and then follow signs to the Asthma & Allergy Center.
